PET CARE GUIDELINES - POST MICROCHIPPING PROCEDURE

Adverse reactions to microchips or post-procedure complications are extremely rare but can occur.

A small hole is left in the skin after a microchip has been implanted, which needs about 24 hours to completely heal.

YOU can help to avoid any complications by:

- Taking your pet home and let him/her have a quiet day.
- · Try not to let your pet get over-excited.
- Limit your pet's exercise no rough play.
- Try keeping your cat indoors for the rest of the day.
- Not giving your pet a bath or grooming it for 24 hours.
- Not letting your pet roll around in the dirt for 24 hours.
- Not applying any flea treatments or tropical preparations to the microchipped area for 24 hours.
- Do not rub or prod the insertion area for at least 24 hours as this may cause the microchip to dislodge.
- Keep an eye on the insertion area for any signs of swelling, bleeding or irritation. If you notice any of these symptoms, seek veterinary advice immediately.

MICROCHIPPING

Microchipping is the insertion of a permanent electronic identification device into the animal. Each microchip has a unique number which provides permanent identification and lifetime registration for your pet.

Within the next 7 days the microchip details will be recorded on DACO (Dogs and Cats Online)

The microchip number can be read with a microchip scanner by vets, shelters or councils. The unique microchip number can be traced back to DACO where your details and that of your pet are stored. If your pet is lost anywhere

in South Australia your contact details can be accessed 24/7 by authorised authorities to help in returning your loved one home.

YOU MUST COMPLETE THE MICROCHIP REGISTRATION

HOW TO COMPLETE YOUR DACO CATS MICROCHIP REGISTRATION

If you already have an account Login* and select 'Complete Microchip/Desexing Record' (and complete steps 3, 5 and 6 below)

- 1. Select Register
- 2. I would like to Register my new animal
- 3. Enter Microchip number and your Surname
- 4. Check if you have an account if so, select your account or continue as a new owner
- 5. Ensure your details are correct
- 6. Complete the Registration

*Select Forgotten your password to set a new one. If you don't have internet access or an email address, contact your council for assistance.

UPDATE YOUR DETAILS

For lost pets to be returned home safely, owners must keep their contact details up to date. If you change address, contact details, sell or give your pet away it is your responsibility to inform DACO as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP

To change ownership of a pet log in to your DACO account and as the registered owner you can change the ownership details online yourself.
